Speech Strand Report Plan

Speech Strand Definition: Speak in an organized and effective manner and listen critically and with comprehension

The COM faculty is requesting that the name of the strand be changed to Communication, which is more contemporary, used more widely in the national college and university setting, and is the term used in the professional organization, the National Communication Association. Hence, the new strand would read

Communication: Speak in an organized and effective manner and listen critically and with comprehension

Outcomes:

#1: The student will prepare and deliver a researched, organized, and purposeful speech.

#2: The student will speak clearly, succinctly, and appropriately before an audience.

#3: The student will demonstrate critical and comprehensive listening through evaluating messages conveyed by others.

Assessment Methods:

Outcomes #1 & 2: The student will be asked to apply techniques, methods, or concepts by preparing and delivering a speech.

The rubric for the application will be as follows:

Preparation: 0=did not demonstrate, 1=poor-lack of skills-major and minor mistakes take away from, 2=good-demonstrates skill-minor mistakes, 3=excellent—demonstrates outstanding skill

Delivery: 0=did not demonstrate, 1=poor-lack of skills-major and minor mistakes take away from, 2=good-demonstrates skill-minor mistakes, 3=excellent—demonstrates outstanding skill

Outcome #3: The student will be asked to apply techniques, methods, or concepts by analyzing a speech.

The rubric for the application will be as follows:

Listening for comprehension and evaluation: 0=did not demonstrate, 1=poor-lack of skills-major and minor mistakes take away from, 2=good-demonstrates skill-minor mistakes, 3=excellent—demonstrates outstanding skill

Standard of success:

The standard of success will be an average of 2.1 for each outcome, which is 70% of 3.

Sampling method:

Currently, the Communication strand includes six different courses. The COM faculty believes COM 130 Introduction to Mass Communication should be added to the list of courses that fulfill the strand. (See the updated Master Syllabus). From these courses one section each will be randomly selected for the assessment. This will then total six or seven sections.

Timeline:

A first run of the assessment plan will occur winter term 2007.
