Course Objectives

- 1. Emulate the styles of music studied, attempt to communicate through certain rhythmic, melodic and harmonic elements that are essential to each musical style.
- 2. Compare and contrast the variety of concepts or basis for each musical style to those with which they are familiar.
- 3. Define Blues, its chords, melodic concepts, and rhythmic principles. Students will practice each series of techniques and apply them to the expression of their own emotions and personal experiences.

- 4. Apply each of the techniques to jazz and combo jazz.
- 5. Apply the building blocks of standard jazz repertoire. These include II/V/I progressions, dominant alterations, and songform harmonic progressions (i.e. "I've got rhythm").
- 6. Listen to and emulate melodic contour and tension/release structures of jazz styles of standard jazz repertoire.
- 7. Recognize the role of each rhythm section instrument in group communication. Rhythm section members will practice and attempt to emulate various techniques to establish a solid rhythmic and harmonic structure for improvisation.
- 8. Practice the techniques learned in a manner consistent with active group-jazz communication.
- 9. Practice individually their own improvisations on the form of each selected piece, paying especially close attention to inter-group communication.
