## **Course Objectives**

- 1. Demonstrate Musical Theatre techniques such as "belting", "operatic", "speech-based recitation" or "rock musical".
- 2. Apply diverse diaphragmatic breath support techniques as determined by the Musical Theatre piece.
- 3. Apply the use of diction and projection as determined by the Musical Theatre piece.
- 4. Sing using the various vocal registers as appropriate to the Musical Theatre piece.
- 5. Practice memorization by executing memorized performance.
- 6. Demonstrate character motivation using deliberate vocal performance choices as determined by the Musical Theatre piece.
- 7. Demonstrate complex emotional expression using deliberate vocal performance choices as determined by the Musical Theatre piece.
- 8. Demonstrate complex emotional expression using diverse and deliberate body language performance choices.
