Course Objectives

- 3. Model professional standard innovation and artistic sensitivity.
- 4. Practice and perform for a predetermined set of performances as best enhance student understanding of professional performance standards.
- 5. In all disciplines, demonstrate essential vocabulary critical to the discipline. In music, demonstrate common keys and meters, playing scales, rhythms, and/or chord progressions and transposition, as required, in professional performance.
- 6. Create or build "unique" or innovative art works each semester based on class instrumentation and skills at a professional level.
- 7. Model the ability to work within and motivate a sense of performance community at a professional level.
- 8. Demonstrate the necessary discipline in attendance and preparation as required by professionals in all areas
- 9. Contribute individual creative ideas to the ensemble and the composition of unique ensemble works, including the investment of outside of class time to perfect contributions.
