Proposed Start Semester: Winter 2012

Course Description: This is an advanced performance-oriented course for woodwinds, brass, percussion and string instruments, as well as electronic keyboards and vocalists. There is an emphasis on more advanced musical phrasing, blending, style and improvisation. This course will focus on advanced melodic, harmonic and rhythmic skills necessary for performing in a big-band setting. The class will perform in the community and on campus. The lessons focusing on musical skills vary depending on the musical selections, which change each semester; therefore, the course may be repeated a maximum of two times for credit.

Course Objectives

1. Perform the major scale in all 12 keys using various techniques, including but not limited to: long tone (for wind), intervallic (for dexterity), increasing volume (for phrasing and style).

2. Play both major and minor scales with a metronome to display a sense of timing.

3. Tune the instrument (as appropriate).

4. Add additional exercises to repertoire as skills and abilities increase.

5. Analyze chords and harmony to identify which notes are available/appropriate for use when improvising.

6. Build a range of options (chords and complementary notes) to select from when constructing a solo.

7. Read and perform a variety of musical arrangements which contain different levels of reading and performance skills.

8. Perform an improvised solo that encompasses melody key changes in multiple rhythms.
