Course description

Brief statement of the purpose and content of the course

This course provides the student the opportunity to learn several different techniques from the Rock guitar genre. Classes will cover several styles from the fifties through current rock music trends. Students will need an electric guitar, small amplifier, and an understanding of tablature notation.

Course outcomes

Outcomes

Provide students with the "Rock Guitar" styles and techniques that are useful and interesting to the developing rock guitarist enabling them to make the transition from a novice guitarist to the professional performing musician. The student will be able to perform "Rock Guitar" music of four different decades with proficiency, providing a clear and concise explanation distinguishing the musical changes Rock music has gone through over the past 40 years.

Assessment Method

Pre-test/Post-test

The student will perform songs from all of the eras covered in the course in front of an panel of judges in a stage setting. Students will be judged on retention of information covered in the course, sound quality, execution, phrasing and technique. Musical interpretation will be evaluated, as a means to assess the students ability to internalize the music.

Unit and Unit Objectives

Unit No. 1 Perform rock guitar techniques from the fifties.

- a. Execute guitar stylings of performers like Chuck Berry, Elvis Presley, Bill Haley
- b. Analyze and articulate the scale usage in popular Rock & Roll music of the 50's
 - c. Execute scales used in popular Rock & Roll music of the 50's
- d. Read a guitar solo written in guitar tablature (guitar music notation)

Unit No. 2.Perform rock guitar techniques from the sixties.

- a. Execute guitar stylings of performers like The Beatles, Eric Clapton, Jimi Hendrix, and Motown.
- b. Examine the influences of the Blues guitar style in Rock & Roll music of the sixties and be able to incorporate it into a Rock guitar solo.
- c. Execute chords used in Rock & Roll music known as "Power Chords."
- d. Analyze and execute the role of rhythm guitar playing in Rock & Roll music of the sixties.
 - e. Distinguish the difference between rhythm guitar playing in

Evaluation Method

The students are graded based on their weekly attendance and class participation.

90% of the grade is based on the homework.

10% of the grade is based on class participation.

- 1. The student must perform the assignments covered in class from the previous week. A midterm examination and a final examination.
- 2. Established weekly evaluation and oral quizzes.

Unit No.4 Perform guitar techniques from the eighties.

- b. Perform fast picking and sweeping techniques using $32^{\rm nd}$ Notes and $64^{\rm th}$ Notes.
- c. Perform linear scales in all 12 keys utilizing the entire neck of the guitar.
