#### Unit #1 - Vocal Technique

- 1. The student will execute proper body alignment, breathing, and tone production through progressively more difficult exercises.
- 2. The student will review the vocal anatomy and proper care of the vocal instrument.
- 3. The student will identify and execute vocal resonance and bel canto tone production utilized in classical singing.

## Unit #2 - Foreign Language Diction

- 1. The student will recognize and reproduce the sounds of each character of the International Phonetic Alphabet.
- 2. The student will transliterate English, German, French, and Italian texts into the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) and to reproduce the sounds of each language from an IPA transliteration.

#### Unit #3 – Vocal Literature

- 1. The student will perform standard beginning repertoire from each of the primary vocal languages: English, French, Italian, and German.
- 2. The student will differentiate the interpretive styles of the vocal traditions of each language.
- The student will study the contributions of primary composers in each language.
- 4. The student will identify and study the primary classical vocal genres: Art Song, Oratorio, Opera, and Orchestral Repertoire.

## Unit #4 -Song Preparation and Rehearsal Techniques

- 1. The student will execute the steps involved in self-learning a song (rhythm alone, diction, words and rhythm, melody alone, melody in rhythm, words, rhythm and melody together).
- 2. The student will follow the steps necessary in the preparation of classical song repertoire, including:
  - Transliteration of foreign language songs
  - Translation of foreign language songs
  - Understanding of all interpretive markings
  - Researching song backgrounds (composer, musical period, song context, etc.)
- 3. The student will identify the technical challenges presented in the context of vocal repertoire and will execute appropriate exercises and techniques for mastering such passages.
