- 12. Discuss the application of perioperative clinical skills.
- 13. Demonstrate prepping, scrubbing, gowning and gloving.
- 14. Demonstrate the steps in the surgical time-out process.
- 15. Identify the nurse's role in reducing patient fire, radiation or laser risks.
- 16. Identify the process steps necessary for sterilization of instruments.
- 17. Demonstrate aseptic techniques and identify boundaries of the sterile field.
