Admission Requirements to Ferris:

1. Minimum credits for admission to the degree program require the completion of at least 56 transferable credits from WCC or an Associate Degree.
2. A 2.5 overall GPA is required for admission. Official college transcripts must be submitted at time of application for admission.
3. Completion of MATH 169 and ENG 226 with a grade of C or better is required.

Admission Requirements to Level II Teacher Education

Coursework:

4. Successful completion of all three subsections of the *Michigan Test for Teacher Certification – Basic Skills Test* is required. Information about this test can be found by browsing the Web at www.mttc.nesinc.com
5. Submission of an FIA (Family Independence Agency) report
6. Submission of a "Professional Dispositions Policy" Form

Financial Aid Requirements:

1. To be considered for financial aid, students must be enrolled in six or more credit hours between Ferris and WCC each semester.
2. Students may be enrolled concurrently at Ferris and WCC.

Graduation Requirements:

1. To graduate, students must have a 2.5 Cumulative GPA in all FSU courses and meet the GPA requirements of their Elementary Education teaching minors, planned program minor, and the professional sequence of classes.
2. Students must meet the University General Education hours requirement with a 2.0 GPA in their general education coursework or have the MACRAO Stamp on their transcripts. Please see advisor for details.
3. 134-140 credit hours are required for graduation.
4. At least 30 FSU semester hours must be completed to fulfill FSU residency requirements.

**421-433 courses are usually taken as a block with 80 hours of field placement as a practicum. Prior to participating in these field experiences and the directed teaching semester, a student must have a criminal background check and fingerprints taken.

ADDITIONAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Students who complete all of their required content coursework and the professional teacher education sequence of classes, which includes field experiences, student teaching (including a criminal background check and finger prints taken), must also pass the MTTC (Michigan Test of Teacher Certification) and meet specific grade point requirements to be recommended for teacher certification through Ferris State University. Additionally, students must pass a First Aid/CPR course that has been approved by the American Heart Association or the Red Cross.
