The Academic Essay: Three Common Patterns

An <u>essay</u> is a multiple-paragraph piece of writing in which you try to inform persuade, or entertain the reader.

A <u>thesis statement</u> is a one-sentence statement of the main idea of your essay; it must identify your subject and make an assertion about it. Think of your thesis as a one-sentence answer to the question "What are you trying to prove?" A good academic essay should contain a thesis statement.

Make sure that you <u>support</u> your thesis adequately. Think of your body paragraphs as the answer to the question "Why should we believe you?" or "What have you got to go on?"
